Mysteries of Christian Initiation: There is to be **preparatory instruction** for parents and godparents prior to the celebration of the **Mysteries of Christian Initiation – Baptism, Chrismation, and Eucharist**. It is desirable that Christian Initiation be celebrated together with the Sunday Divine Liturgy, as the entire faith community welcomes its newest member. Those selected to be sponsors must be persons who are qualified to be a sponsor according to the norms of Church law and practice.

Crowning in Marriage: A **six month period of preparation** is to precede the marriage. Couples are to meet with the pastor before other arrangements are scheduled. The **Pre-Cana Program** offered by the Archeparchy in the spring of each year is a **required** part of the marriage preparation for all couples.

Holy Anointing & Pastoral Care of the Ill: Please contact the pastor prior to surgery or in the event of illness to require the **Mystery of Holy Anointing**. When you or a family member are hospitalized or enter a nursing home or other facility, **please inform the pastor**. Due to privacy regulations, hospitals and other facilities do not always notify the pastor; and it is best for the family.

Mystery of Repentance (Confessions): **Saturdays: 3:00 pm (Portage) and 4:30 pm (Beaverdale/Dunlo)**. Also, **½ hour before services [except Sunday]**, and by appointment. Confessions are in the priest's sacristy area, before an icon of Christ, before whom we are confessing our sinfulness.

Opportunities for Stewardship: Parishioners are asked to make a commitment of **Time, Talent, and Treasure...** **Work Parties** are scheduled the first Saturday of each month, and **Church Cleaning** is scheduled the first Monday, unless a Church Feast Day falls on the same date.

Theophany—the Baptism of our Lord Synaxis of Saint John the Baptist

We who witnessed the Great Sanctification of Water, both at the Vigil on Friday evening and at the Divine Liturgy on Saturday can recognize the solemnity and importance of the Feast of the Theophany. Among the more significant aspects of this feast is the historical connection with Baptism. On this day, Catechumens [candidates preparing for Baptism] were baptized in a very solemn fashion, much as on Pascha [the Resurrection].

The two feasts of Nativity and Theophany [Baptism of our Lord] bring into the foreground the essentials of the faith. It is into these primary components of the faith that the new Christians were consecrated and initiated. There is first the *Incarnation*, that the Word of God become man, which is celebrated in the Nativity. And now the Baptism of the Lord in the Jordan highlights the union of God in the Trinity.

While the union of the human and divine natures is realized to perfection in Christ, and yet on Theophany we are made aware that now it is ourselves who are reunited to God. The feast of Theophany continues throughout this week and concludes next Sunday, January 14. It is a time for us to be enlivened with the joy and love for the Lord who descended to us sinners in order to clothe us in his power and splendor. Thus, we sing on Theophany:

“All you who have been baptized into Christ have been clothed with Christ. Alleluia!”

Also, today on January 7 we have a solemn memorial to honor Saint John the Baptist, who had a preeminent role in the Baptism of the Lord. Called the *Synaxis of Saint John the Baptist*, it recalls the great crowd of people hastening to hear the preaching of John and to do penance.

“As a lover of the Holy Spirit, O Forerunner, and as a swallow sweetly singing of divine grace, you have made known to all people the plan of salvation of their King. He gloriously came forth from the Pure One for the renewal of all He takes away their ancient sadness and reforms the hearts of those baptized in repentance that they may receive eternal life. O blessed Prophet, inspired by God.” [Aposticha, Vespers for January 7, Synaxis of John the Baptist]

Computer- And Internet-Based Education Program for Cantors

The Metropolitan Cantor Institute now offers a computer- and Internet-based education program for cantors, with classes offered on a regular schedule throughout the year. It is not too late to sign up for the 8-week **Introduction to Church Singing class**, which covers:

<i>the role of the cantor;</i>	<i>fundamentals of music theory and sight-singing</i>
<i>basic vocal technique</i>	<i>psalms, basic responses, and litanies in our chant tradition</i>
<i>the spirit of our chant</i>	

Later courses cover the Divine Liturgy, the Eight Tones, Vespers, and special services. Except for the free **Introduction to Liturgy** and **Introduction to the Typikon** courses, each course uses regular recorded singing by students, with feedback from cantors and professional voice teachers, to help students learn or improve their knowledge and performance of church singing.
