<u>Mysteries of Christian Initiation</u>: There is to be preparatory instruction for parents and godparents prior to the celebration of the <u>Mysteries of Christian Initiation</u> – <u>Baptism</u>, <u>Chrismation</u>, and <u>Eucharist</u>. It is desirable that Christian Initiation be celebrated together with the Sunday Divine Liturgy, as the entire faith community welcomes its newest member. Those selected to be sponsors must be persons who are qualified to be a sponsor according the norms of Church law and practice.

<u>Crowning in Marriage:</u> A six month period of preparation is to precede the marriage. Couples are to meet with the pastor before other arrangements are scheduled. The **Pre-Cana Program** offered by the Archeparchy in the spring of each year is a *required* part of the marriage preparation for all couples.

<u>Holy Anointing & Pastoral Care of the III</u>: Please contact the pastor prior to surgery or in the event of illness to require the **Mystery of Holy Anointing**. When you or a family member are hospitalized or enter a nursing home or other facility, **please inform the pastor**. Due to privacy regulations, hospitals and other facilities do not always notify the pastor; and it is best for the family.

Mystery of Repentance (Confessions): Saturdays: 3:00 pm (Portage) and 4:30 pm (Beaverdale/Dunlo). Also, ½ hour before services [except Sunday], and by appointment. Confessions are in the priest's sacristy area, before an icon of Christ, before whom we are confessing our sinfulness.

<u>Opportunities for Stewardship</u>: Parishioners are asked to make a commitment of Time, Talent, and Treasure... Work Parties are scheduled the first Saturday of each month, and Church Cleaning is scheduled the first Monday, unless a Church Feast Day falls on the same date.

Palm Sunday & the Feast of the Annunciation of the Theotokos

Feast of the Annunciation: "In the tradition of the Church, the Feast of the Annunciation is celebrated on whatever day it falls, even on Good Friday or Pascha. It is the celebration of the central mystery of the incarnation of our Lord, when he emptied himself to take the human nature, though remaining God in eternity. This feast then celebrates what it means to be Christian, for us to follow the Lord, for he humbled himself in his conception in the womb of Mary, and on Palm Sunday, he humbles himself, riding on the colt of an ass, to submit himself to the will of his Father in his passion, death and resurrection. Thus the combination of these two feast celebrates the central mystery of our Christian faith."

Holy Week: "In this week, the most solemn of the Church Year, we relive the mystery of God's merciful loving-kindness, when he suffered death and burial for our salvation, and is risen for our hope of eternal life. During Holy Week, we do not only observe what happened in history, but through our acts of repentance, our prayers and fasting, our processions and veneration, take an active part in what we remember as having happened and what is happening now through divine remembrance. We die in Christ and rise in the fullness of life."

Mystery of Repentance - Confession

- On Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday at 6:00 pm, before Liturgy of Presanctified Gifts.
- On Thursday at 1:00 pm and 6:00 pm in Portage.
- There are **no Confessions** scheduled after Thursday of Holy Week.
- You may also call the rectory to schedule an appointment.

Journey Through Holy Week...

- Fasting and Strict Abstinence from meat and dairy products is prescribed for Great & Holy Friday [March 30]. Fasting and Abstinence from meat is prescribed on Wednesday and Saturday of the Holy Week, and is recommended for Holy Thursday.
- For the *processions* on Good Friday and Paschal Matins [Saturday evening], *battery operated LED* candles will be distributed. A switch on the bottom turns the light on/off.
- <u>Please note</u> that *two ushers* will be near the grave to be available for those who may need assistance as they approach or leave the veneration of the grave.

Regulations for Great and Holy Week - 2018

<u>Simple abstinence</u>: The law of simple abstinence forbids the use of meat, but permits the use of eggs and dairy products. All faithful of the Archeparchy who receive the Eucharist are obliged to observe simple abstinence when prescribed. Abstinence is obligatory Wednesday and Saturday of Holy Week and is recommended for Holy Thursday.

<u>Strict abstinence:</u> The law of strict abstinence (fast) forbids the use and consumption of all meat, eggs and dairy products. All faithful of the Archeparchy who receive the Eucharist are obliged to observe strict abstinence when prescribed. Strict abstinence is to be observed on <u>Great and Holy Friday, March 30</u>.
