<u>Mysteries of Christian Initiation</u>: There is to be preparatory instruction for parents and godparents prior to the celebration of the <u>Mysteries of Christian Initiation</u> – <u>Baptism</u>, <u>Chrismation</u>, and <u>Eucharist</u>. It is desirable that Christian Initiation be celebrated together with the Sunday Divine Liturgy, as the entire faith community welcomes its newest member. Those selected to be sponsors must be persons who are qualified to be a sponsor according the norms of Church law and practice.

<u>Crowning in Marriage:</u> A six month period of preparation is to precede the marriage. Couples are to meet with the pastor before other arrangements are scheduled. The **Pre-Cana Program** offered by the Archeparchy in the spring of each year is a *required* part of the marriage preparation for all couples.

<u>Holy Anointing & Pastoral Care of the III</u>: Please contact the pastor prior to surgery or in the event of illness to require the **Mystery of Holy Anointing**. When you or a family member are hospitalized or enter a nursing home or other facility, **please inform the pastor**. Due to privacy regulations, hospitals and other facilities do not always notify the pastor; and it is best for the family to notify the pastor.

Mystery of Repentance (Confessions): Saturdays: 3:00 pm (Portage) and 4:30 pm (Beaverdale/Dunlo). Also, ½ hour before services [except Sunday], and by appointment. Confessions are in the priest's sacristy area, before an icon of Christ, before whom we are confessing our sinfulness.

<u>Opportunities for Stewardship</u>: Parishioners are asked to make a commitment of **Time, Talent, and Treasure**... **Work Parties** are scheduled the first Saturday of each month, and **Church Cleaning** is scheduled the first Monday, unless a Church Feast Day falls on the same date.

84th Annual Pilgrimage in Honor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help

Below is information on the chartered bus to the Pilgrimage at Mount Saint Macrina. The tradition of the Uniontown pilgrimage is traced to the icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help given to the Sisters of Saint Basil by Pope Pius XI. The theme for this year's Pilgrimage is: "Mary, Hope of All Generations".

When Pope Pius XI of blessed memory sent the gift of an Icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help to the Sisters of St. Basil, he requested that the Sisters spread devotion to the Mother of God under this title. In response, the Sisters initiated a Pilgrimage in her honor. Since 1934, thousands of Pilgrims have made the sacred journey of Pilgrimage to Mount St. Macrina. Here they place their needs, their hopes and desires in prayer at the Shrine of Our Lady of Perpetual Help.

This year, the Sisters of St. Basil the Great celebrate the 84th Annual Pilgrimage in honor of our Lady of Perpetual Help. Therefore, it is quite appropriate that the original icon that was presented to the Sisters by Pope Pius XI, will be the centerpiece of this year's sacred journey of the Pilgrimage.

The Pilgrimage provides for the diverse spiritual needs of many pilgrims who frequent this major unifying event in the life of the Byzantine Catholic Church. As the oldest and largest Byzantine Catholic Pilgrimage in the United States, its participants include clergy and faithful from across the country.

The Sisters of St. Basil invite everyone to join them in honoring the Mother of God under the title of Mary, Hope of All Generations. With them, she waits to welcome all to her Shrine on Mount St. Macrina.
