<u>Mysteries of Christian Initiation</u>: There is to be <u>preparatory instruction</u> for parents and godparents prior to the celebration of the <u>Mysteries of Christian Initiation – Baptism, Chrismation, and Eucharist</u>. It is desirable that Christian Initiation be celebrated together with the Sunday Divine Liturgy, as the entire faith community welcomes its newest member. Those selected to be sponsors must be persons who are qualified to be a sponsor according the norms of Church law and practice.

<u>Crowning in Marriage:</u> A six month period of preparation is to precede the marriage. Couples are to meet with the pastor before other arrangements are scheduled. The **Pre-Cana Program** offered by the Archeparchy in the spring of each year is a *required* part of the marriage preparation for all couples.

Holy Anointing & Pastoral Care of the III: Please contact the pastor prior to surgery or in the event of illness to require the Mystery of Holy Anointing. When you or a family member are hospitalized or enter a nursing home or other facility, please inform the pastor. Due to privacy regulations, hospitals and other facilities do not always notify the pastor; and it is best for the family to notify the pastor.

Mystery of Repentance (Confessions): Saturdays: 3:00 pm (Portage) and 4:30 pm (Beaverdale/Dunlo). Also, ½ hour before services [except Sunday], and by appointment. Confessions are in the priest's sacristy area, before an icon of Christ, before whom we are confessing our sinfulness.

<u>Opportunities for Stewardship</u>: Parishioners are asked to make a commitment of Time, Talent, and Treasure... Work Parties are scheduled the first Saturday of each month, and Church Cleaning is scheduled the first Monday, unless a Church Feast Day falls on the same date.

Scripture Reflection...

During the six weeks following November 15, the time of *Philip's Fast* is observed in preparation for Christmas. Focusing our attention upon the approaching feast of Christmas as an event of spiritual renewal does not happen easily or without a conscious effort. In any attempt to approach this as a period for payer, fasting, almsgiving we can become readily distracted. There is much that competes for our attention and time during the weeks ahead.

We are counseled in the Apostolic Reading heard today from Ephesians 6:10-17, "Be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on the armor of God so that you may be able to stand firm against the tactics of the devil" [Ephesians 6:10-11]. Several dimensions or tools of our faith are identified for their role and value in equipping us for the effort and exertion of the Christiaan life. In identifying and highlighting these, the Apostle Paul uses images of a soldier and his equipment for battle. He encourages us to put on "the whole armor of God." This includes the "shield of faith", "the helmet of salvation", "the sword of the Spirit which is the Word of God" [Ephesians 6:16-17].

Each of these can serve us as tools to assist us, to use this time of the Advent pre-Christmas season to accompany and strengthen us in our journey of faith.

Prayer for the Christmas Fast

"O Christ our Lord and our God, You did not think equality with God something to be grasped at, but You emptied Yourself, took the form of a slave and were born in human likeness. Enlighten us as we prepare to celebrate the feast of Your holy birth. Make us worthy to see the mystery of Your becoming human for us, while remaining God in eternity. Fill our minds with understanding, that we might see You even in the least of our brothers and sisters. You have given us the gift of Your Holy Spirit, You have loved us even to the point of Your saving death and glorious resurrection, grant us also a faith that cannot be confounded, a love that does not pretend, and a wisdom that is complete. You have said, "Unless you become like little children, you cannot enter the kingdom of heaven," grant that in this feast we may again experience the rebirth we were given in baptism, that we may sing out with the angels, "Glory to God in the highest, and peace on earth to those on whom His favor rests." You have humbled Yourself, O Christ our God, may Your Name be exalted, together with the Name of Your eternal Father and the Name of Your all-holy, good and life-creating Spirit, now and ever and forever."
