<u>Mysteries of Christian Initiation</u>: There is to be preparatory instruction for parents and godparents prior to the celebration of the <u>Mysteries of Christian Initiation</u> – <u>Baptism</u>, <u>Chrismation</u>, and <u>Eucharist</u>. It is desirable that Christian Initiation be celebrated together with the Sunday Divine Liturgy, as the entire faith community welcomes its newest member. Those selected to be sponsors must be persons who are qualified to be a sponsor according the norms of Church law and practice.

<u>Crowning in Marriage:</u> A six month period of preparation is to precede the marriage. Couples are to meet with the pastor before other arrangements are scheduled. The **Pre-Cana Program** offered by the Archeparchy in the spring of each year is a **required** part of the marriage preparation for all couples.

Holy Anointing & Pastoral Care of the III: Please contact the pastor prior to surgery or in the event of illness to require the Mystery of Holy Anointing. When you or a family member are hospitalized or enter a nursing home or other facility, please inform the pastor. Due to privacy regulations, hospitals and other facilities do not always notify the pastor; and it is best for the family to notify the pastor.

Mystery of Repentance (Confessions): Saturdays: 3:00 pm (Portage) and 4:30 pm (Beaverdale/Dunlo). Also, ½ hour before services [except Sunday], and by appointment. Confessions are in the priest's sacristy area, before an icon of Christ, before whom we are confessing our sinfulness.

<u>Opportunities for Stewardship</u>: Parishioners are asked to make a commitment of **Time, Talent, and Treasure**... **Work Parties** are scheduled the first Saturday of each month, and **Church Cleaning** is scheduled the first Monday, unless a Church Feast Day falls on the same date.

Question & Answer Box: "Symbolism of Priest's & Deacon's Vestments"

The question: "What is the symbolism behind the priest's vestments?" was among those in the "Question & Answer Box". In responding to this question last week, it was noted that there are prayers prescribed for the priest and deacon as they put on each vestments. Not only do sacred ministers wear garments distinctive for liturgical functions; they are also clothe themselves with those virtues or dispositions each vestment represents. There is to be, in other words, both internal and external splendor. And so in putting on each vestment, they say the prescribed prayers which usually consist in verses from the Psalms. We will consider these for insights on the meaning of each.

Feasts of our Church This Week...

Wednesday, January 30 is the *Feast of the Three Holy Hierarchs*. This commemoration of the three great Doctors of the Church—Saint John Chrysostom; Saint Basil the Great; and Saint Gregory the Theologian—has its origin at a time when a quarrel as to which one of these three was the greatest. Because this controversy divided the people of Constantinople, Patriarch John appointed as arbitrator, a learned and holy man, who devoted himself to prayer to seek a solution. Basil, Gregory and Chrysostom appeared to him in a dream and told him they were equal before God. Each one had his own personality, genius and value. This feast honors all three of them to affirm this truth and restore peace and unity to the Church.

On <u>Saturday</u>, <u>February 2</u> we celebrate the **Meeting of our Lord with Simeon and Anna**. The Presentation of our Lord in the Temple is in fact the first meeting of the Lord with his people. The birth of Christ, the adoration of the shepherds and wise men had been confined to the small circle of the Holy Family's abode. Today, Christ appears in the midst of his people. Mary chose to obey the Mosaic Law, which prescribed that forty days after the birth of her Son, she went to Jerusalem in order to offer the prescribed sacrifice.
